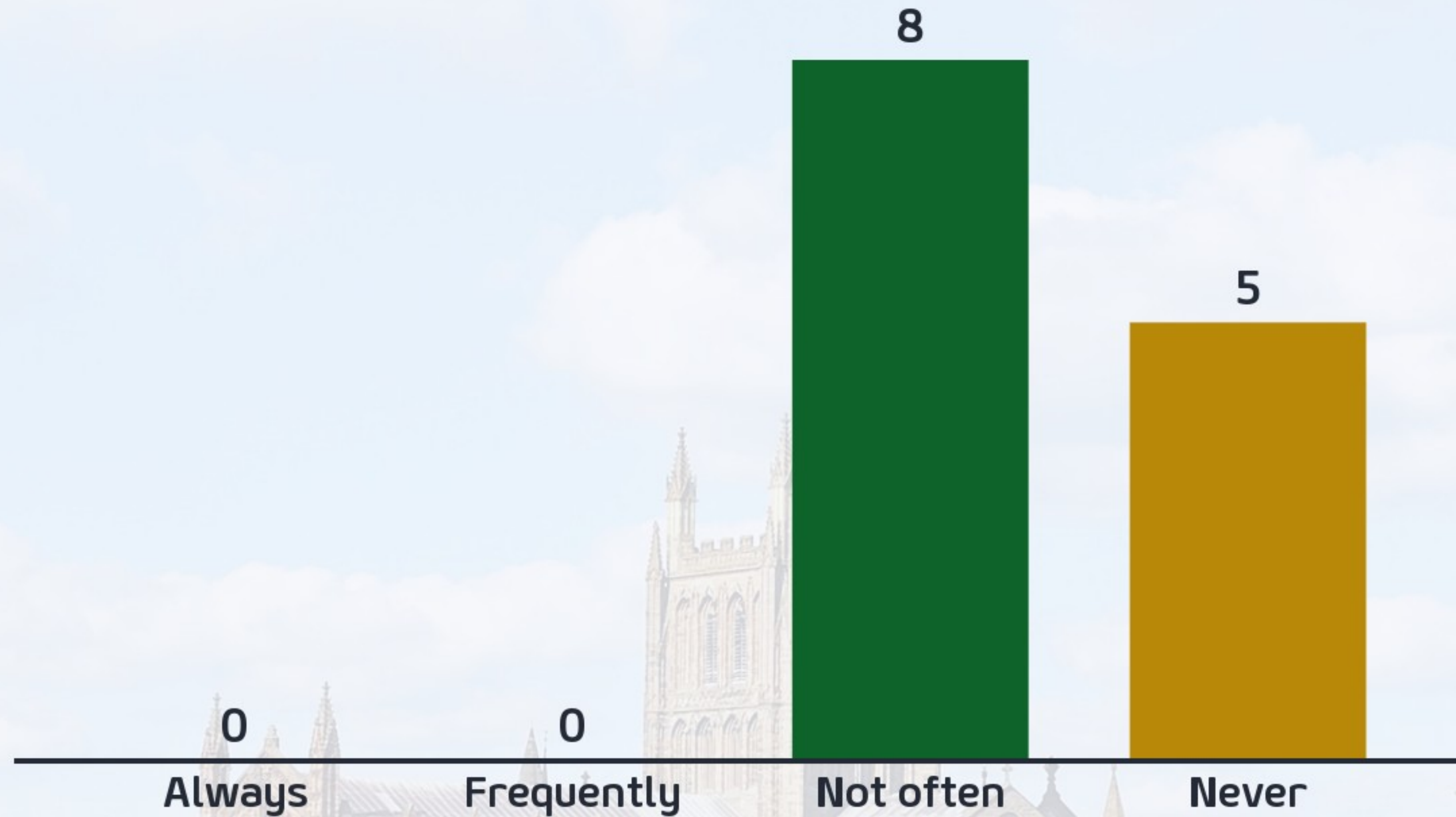


Do you believe that 'Heritage interpretation' is at odds with your church environment?
