
In 1950 the tower was lowered by 30ft. The bells were rebung on the oak frame and lay silent for almost 70 genrs.



SMALMAN MONUMENT



Francis Smalman (1565 – 1633) of Kinnersley Castle and Letton, was an MP in 1621 under the reign of James I and again under the reign of Charles I in 1626.

This fine alabaster and black marble monument was erected


and Susan. William, in 1635 and is dedicated to William's parents Francis and Susan. William (b 1615) was also a politician, becoming an MP in the Short Parliament of 1640.

Susan Clark was Francis' second wife and the mother of William. It was also her second marriage.


The monument depicts the couple facing each other beneath a canopy with drapes and trumpet-bearing cherubs. Beneath are depicted their children by both of their marriages. Underneath the monument is also a brass plaque to William Leviot, former priest, who died in 1421.

Francis reputedly acquired Kinnersley Castle around 1616 from the son of Roger Vaughan. The monument is described as "a very fine piece" and "the sculpturally best of any group" by Sir Nikolaus Pevsner in his book on Herefordshire buildings.

We are currently in the process of raising funds towards repairing and supporting the monument to ensure it does not collapse.







Hand-held boards

The Ford The name of this feature of the Church is treat the Latin word force, meaning a spring of water. Water is a symbol of the reas spiritual life which Christians have in God and their entry into the new life is shown by the rite of baptiers. A new mander of the Church shows his or her commitment to the Christian faith by following the example of Janue Christ in baptiers. Water is poused into the first and Te bleesed by the priset. The sign of the cross is made on the forehand of the candidate after spinkling the water on his or her head. At the baptiens there is an affirmation of faith by the new member of the Church and atterwards he or she is welcomed by the rest of the The water is a symbol both of the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, and of the purification of Christiams from their sin. The font, holding the water for this solemn

ceremony, is full of significance in it's shape and the material from which it is made. The Font in this Church is made of a single, massive stone decorated with saltire crosses. The round font symbolises rebirth through faith. It may date as far back as the fourteenth century.
